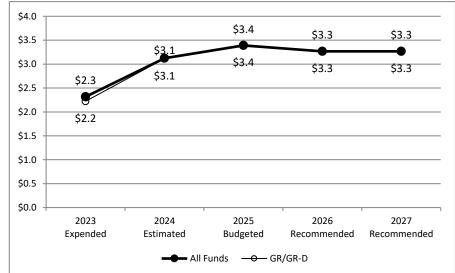

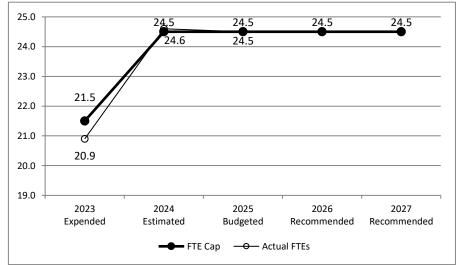

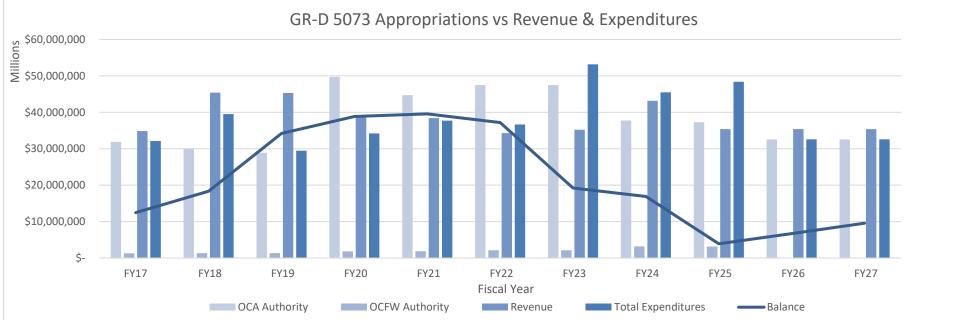
Office of Capital and Forensic Writs Selected Fiscal and Policy Issues - Senate

 Method of Finance Swap. Recommendations include restructuring the appropriation of funds from General Revenue – Dedicated Fair Defense Account No. 5073 (GR-D Fund 5073) so that the Office of Capital and Forensic Writs (OCFW) receives the entirety of its appropriations through the General Revenue Fund. The method of finance swap totals \$7.7 million, including \$6.5 million for agency salaries and operations and an estimated \$1.2 million in benefits costs. (See also, OCA Selected Fiscal and Policy Issue #2).

Revenues from GR-D Fund 5073 also fund the operation of the Texas Indigent Defense Commission (TIDC) including Administration; Formula Grants, which provides grants to all Texas counties for indigent defense; Discretionary Grants, which provides competitive grants to counties for programs that improve indigent defense; Cost Containment Initiative; and Innocence Projects at six law schools.

GR-D Fund 5073 revenues include 17.8857 percent of the court costs paid by people convicted of an offense; one-third of each \$15 fee paid by a surety posting a bail bond; 50.0 percent of State Bar membership fees; and unexpended balances exceeding \$10.0 million in the Jury Service Fund No. 328.

The Office of Court Administration estimates that collected revenues and available fund balances for GR-D Fund 5073 will total \$71.9 million, a decrease of \$10.8 million from the 2024-25 biennium spending levels.

TIDC projections do not anticipate additional transfers into GR-D Fund 5073 for future biennia, citing increased reimbursements (\$34 to \$52) to counties pursuant to House Bill 3474, Eighty-eighth Legislature, Regular Session, 2023.

pre-pandemic collections. Senate Bill 346,

FY24 revenues for GR-D Fund 5073 increased 22.0 percent from amounts collected in FY23, reflecting a restoration to pre-pandemic collections. Senate Bill 346, Eighty-sixth Legislature, Regular Session, 2021, restructured the Consolidated Court cost paid by defendants convicted under certain sections of the Penal Code and redirected juror pay revenues to a newly created Jury Service Fund. The bill required amounts exceeding \$10.0 million in the Jury Service Fund to be transferred into GR-D Fund 5073. To date, GR-D 5073 has not received any transfers resulting in a decline in revenue of approximately \$6.0 million per fiscal year.

By funding the Office of Capital and Forensic Writs with General Revenue, approximately \$7.7 million in GR-D Fund 5073 will available each biennium to address its recurrent shortfalls in court cost fee revenues and fund balance stability.

2. Article-Wide 6.0 Percent Salary Increase for Non-Judicial Staff. Recommendations do not include \$9.8 million in All Funds, including \$9.6 million in General Revenue and \$0.2 million in Other Funds, requested by all Article IV agencies to provide a 6.0 percent salary increase for non-judicial staff.

The total portion of this request for OCFW totals \$0.3 million in General Revenue funding for the 2026-27 biennium (See also, Items Not Included in Recommendations Item #2).

3. Staff Funding and Agency Organization. The Eighty-eighth Legislature, Regular Session, 2023, appropriated an additional \$1.7 million to fund salary increases, in addition to the 10.0 percent increase provided in the 2024-25 biennium, for12.0 attorney positions, 2.0 accountant positions, and 6.0 mitigation specialist positions, as well as 3.0 new legal assistant positions, 1.0 new mitigation specialist position, and for increased operating expenses.

According to the agency, while the effects of increased staff and funding have reduced historically high turnover rates experienced by the agency, it still struggles to attract attorneys and mitigation specialists due to industry competition and an absence of administrative support.

According to the agency, the mean salary of its attorney positions is \$135,269 and the mean salary of its mitigation specialist positions is \$93,125, which are below other regional public defender offices. Another factor impacting the agency's recruitment and retention relates to the job duties of these positions, including timekeeping records. Attorneys and mitigation specialists spend 20.0 percent of their time performing paralegal and administrative tasks. Its accountants spend 25.0 percent of their time performing inventory/office supplies, advertising jobs, and purchasing.

Recommendations do not include the agency's request for \$0.4 million in General Revenue for 3.0 FTE positions to assist with paralegal and administrative support and \$0.2 million for 1.0 mitigation specialist to assist in the creation of a mitigation specialist fellowship program.
