



Office of the Governor Selected Fiscal and Policy Issues - Senate

- 1. **Unexpended Balances (UB).** Recommendations include continuation of authority to carry forward UB within and between biennia. The agency reported in its 2024-25 base reconciliation carry forward of approximately \$6.1 million in General Revenue from fiscal year 2023 into the 2024-25 biennium. The agency's 2024-25 base reconciliation anticipated carry forward of \$3.4 million in General Revenue from fiscal year 2024 into fiscal year 2025. The agency estimates balances of \$0 for carry forward into the 2026-27 biennium. Recommendations revise Rider 5, Unexpended Between Biennia, accordingly.
- 2. **Transfer of Appropriations and Full-Time Equivalents (FTEs).** Recommendations continue the authority to allow the transfer of appropriations and FTEs between the Office of the Governor and Trusteed Programs Within the Office of the Governor, and the transfer of appropriations and FTEs from the Office of the Governor and Trusteed Programs Within the Office of the Governor to other agencies, within the limits established by Article IX, Section 14.01, Appropriation Transfers. The agency has requested changes to this rider to remove the limitations of the Article IX provision, which are not included in these recommendations.

Office of the Governor Rider Highlights - Senate

Modification of Existing Riders

5. **Unexpended Balances Between Biennia.** Recommendations remove the inclusion of any estimated unexpended balances (estimated to be \$0) as part of the agency's regular appropriations. Authority to carry forward unexpended balances across biennia is continued.

The following riders include recommendations to remove obsolete language, make conforming changes such as updating fiscal years and amounts to reflect funding recommendations, and clarify rider deadlines:
